KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, Isaac Gill and Alice L. Gill, husband and wife, both of Mendon in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, hereby constitute and appoint Joseph H. Doyle of Milford, in said Commonwealth, the true and lawful Attorney of the said Alice L. Gill for her and in her name and stead unless this power shall be sooner revoked by an instrument of revocation recorded in the Registry of Deeds for the County of Worcester in said Commonwealth, to release any and all rights of or to both DOWER and HOMESTEAD which have been or may hereafter be acquired by the said Alice L.
