A certain parcel of land located in the Town of Mendon on the northerly side of Park Street, bounded and described as follow:

Beginning at a point on the north side of the highway, called Park Street, said point being three hundred feet easterly from the southeast corner of a cemetery, known as the "Daniels Cemetery".

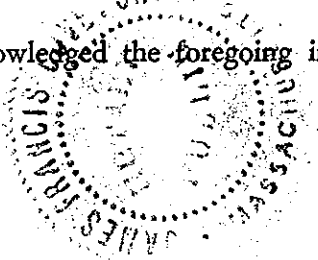
