David S. Messenger the twenty first day of May in the year four Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and forty five and recorded in the office of the Registry  
of deeds for the County of Worcester Book 399 page 487, in consider-  
-ation of the sum of three hundred and fifty five Dollars to us paid  
by David S. Messenger of Worcester in the County of Worcester the re-  
-ceipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge do by these presents grant  
sell and convey unto the said Messenger his heirs and assigns the  
Pews numbered <sup>seventy</sup> seven and seventeen in the meeting house situ-  
-ated on Elm street in the town of Worcester called the Church  
of the Unity — To have and to hold the same to him the said  
Messenger his heirs and assigns and to his and their use forever —  
In witness whereof we the said Merrick and Rice have hereunto  
set our hands and seals this fourteenth day of May in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six,

road leading from Mendon to Uxbridge by the parish meeting house  
thence north 15° west seven rods and twelve links to stake & stones and  
-bounding westerly on said Comstock's land thence north 85<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>° East six  
rods and an half link to corner of land owned by said Marcia Stone
