Know all men by these presents, that I George Brown of Fitchburg in the County of Worcester & Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of eighteen hundred dollars paid by Franklin Phillips of said Fitchburg yeoman the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do give, grant, sell and convey unto the said Franklin Phillips his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land with all buildings thereon lying near the Village in said Fitchburg and bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at the Southerly corner of the abutment of the stone arch Bridge; thence running on the road or river Street, so called, South  $\frac{5}{3}$  West 2 rods & 22 links; thence South  $\frac{7}{4}$  West 4 rods & 12 links on the same road or Street to a stone post thence South  $\frac{1}{2}$  East
