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they are free of all incumbrances excepting a mortgage  
of \$1000. this day given by me to the said Taft covering a  
portion of said premises. that I have good right to sell  
and convey the same to the said Taft and that I for  
myself my heirs executors and administrators will war-  
rant and defend the same premises to the said Taft  
his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims  
and demands of all persons excepting those claiming  
under said mortgage. Provided Nevertheless that  
if the said Charles White his heirs executors or admini-  
strators pay to the said Taft his heirs executors admini-  
strators or assigns the sum of one thousand dollars  
in annual instalments of one hundred and fifty  
dollars each with interest on all said sums payable an-  
nually and the further sum of four hundred and  
seventy five dollars in sixty days from the date hereof  
then this deed as also two certain notes bearing even  
date with these presents given by the said White to the  
said Taft to pay the same sums with interest at  
the times aforesaid shall be void. And I Almoria G.  
White wife of Charles White aforesaid for the consideration  
aforesaid do hereby release and quitclaim unto the  
said Taft his heirs and assigns all the right title claim  
or demand which I may have in and unto the  
premises hereby conveyed under or by virtue of the  
homestead exemption laws of the Commonwealth of  
Massachusetts and also all right claim or possibility of  
dower in said premises.
