Item 1<sup>st</sup>. I do hereby order and decree that all my just debts together with all expenses of my last sickness, funeral expenses and expenses of settlement to be paid out of my estate and also that suitable monuments be erected at my grave.

Item 2<sup>d</sup>. I do give and devise to our Elizabeth H. Barker, wife of Dr. John Barker of the said City of Worcester the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100)

Item 3<sup>d</sup>. I do give and devise to our Sarah E. Wall of the said City of Worcester all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal, and of whatsoever name or nature.

Item 4<sup>th</sup>. I do ordain and appoint our Rev. Mr. [unclear] of the said City of Worcester as sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

I Henny Moore Hayward of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts being of good health of body and of sound and disposing mind and memory, praised be God for the same and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs while I have strength and capacity so to do, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

Firstly and principally I commit my soul into the hands of my Creator who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried at the direction of my Executor hereinafter named. And as to such worldly estate, wheresoever it hath pleased God to intrust me, I dispose of the same as followeth.

Secondly. It is my will that all my just debts, and the charges of my funeral, together with the cost of a suitable monument to be erected at my grave, be discharged and paid out of my estate by my Executor hereinafter named, as soon as convenient may be after my decease.

Thirdly. It is my will that no charge for board or clothing be made, by my Executor or by any of my heirs, against any of my children or grand-children for past time or so long as they remain in maintenance of my family.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Moore Hastings Hayward, my silver sugar bowl, cream pitcher, soup ladle and porringer.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath to my son Seth Hastings Hayward and my daughter Anna Moore Hastings Hayward, all the remainder of my silver ware to be equally divided between them.

Sixthly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Moore Hastings Hayward my lounge covered with striped cloth, one small round black walnut and one mahogany card table, the best chair
