Secondly, I give and bequeath to my son Seth Hastings boyward, the portraits of myself and of his father Seth Boyward.

Eighthly, I give and bequeath all the remainder of my household furniture as follows, viz: One third part thereof to my son Seth Hastings boyward, one third part thereof to ^{my} daughter, Anna Dora Hastings boyward, and the remaining third part thereof to be equally divided between them, to my grandsons Frank boyward Bond and Charles Hastings Bond; and it is my earnest wish that my daughter Anna Dora Hastings boyward, shall have the charge and direction of their education at home and elsewhere looking after and caring for them as she would do for her own children.

Ninthly, I give and bequeath to Joanna Hastings widow of the late Robert Hastings, three hundred dollars, to be paid her at such times and in such sums as she may deem fit and proper for her support, and at her decease whatever may remain of the said sum of three hundred dollars I give and bequeath to her son Horatio Nelson Hastings.

Tenthly, I give and bequeath to Horatio Nelson Hastings the further sum of one hundred dollars.

Eleventhly, I give and bequeath to Bernice Thompson widow of the late Peter Thompson the sum of fifty dollars to be paid her at such times and in such sums as she may deem fit and proper for her support; and at her decease whatever may remain of the said sum of fifty dollars, I give and bequeath to her daughter Annie Rebecca Thompson.

Twelfthly, I give and bequeath to Adaline Thompson daughter of the late Peter Thompson the sum of fifty dollars.

Thirteenthly, I give and bequeath to Maria Leary now living in my family the sum of fifty dollars.

Fourteenthly, I give and bequeath to Mary Ann Welch now living in my family the sum of fifty dollars.

Fifteenthly, I give and bequeath to Susan Lucinda and Ellen boyward, daughters of Ebenezer W. boyward now of Newbury the sum of twenty five dollars each.

Sixteenthly, I give and bequeath to Mary Burbeck now of Newbury the sum of twenty five dollars.

Seventeenthly, I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to be divided as follows, viz: One third part thereof to my son Seth Hastings boyward, he to receive

as a portion of this bequest all the notes, securities and demands I may hold against him at my decease; one third part thereof to my daughter Anna Dora Hastings boyward, and the remaining third part thereof to my grandsons Frank boyward Bond and Charles Hastings Bond, they to receive as a portion of this bequest all the notes, securities and demands which I may hold against their father, Eli Bond. The said Frank boyward Bond and Charles Hastings Bond to have equal shares in this bequest, and should they or either of them die and leave no widow or issue lawfully begotten of their bodies then and ever may remain of the portion of my estate hereby bequeathed to them I give and bequeath in equal shares to my son Seth Hastings boyward and my daughter Anna Dora Hastings boyward and their heirs.

Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Dr. John Henry Metcalf of Mendon aforesaid sole executor of this my last Will and Testament.

In witness whereof I the said Mary Dora boyward have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and seal at Mendon this twenty fourth day of October in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven. Mary Dora boyward (dead).
