heap of stones by the road leading from Alex<sup>s</sup> Thayer on to  
Calberhill (so called) all the before mentioned lines are by land  
of S<sup>d</sup> Alex<sup>s</sup> and William Thayer near as the farm now stands  
thence bounded Westerly Northwesterly and Westerly by and with said  
road until it comes to a corner of John Pomeroy's land & also  
to land of Alvin and Abay Allen then turning Easterly and  
bounded Southerly partly by said Allen and partly by Na-  
hurn Whulock's land to a heap of stones by the wall own<sup>d</sup> Alvens
