Aldrich Luke. Know all men by these presents, that I Luke Aldrich Jr. of Mendon, in the county of Worcester, & Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman, in consideration of three thousand dollars, paid by Nathan Aldrich, of Mendon, in the county of Worcester & Commonwealth aforesaid, yeoman, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell & convey unto the said Nathan Aldrich, his heirs & assigns, a certain tract, or parcel of land, lying & being in the aforesaid town of Mendon, containing by estimation, one hundred and thirty acres, by the same more or less, & is the same that was conveyed to me by my late father, Luke Aldrich deceased, by his deed bearing date Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> 1814. Bounded & bounded as follows viz. Beginning at a heap of stones, on the west side of Relicott's road, so called, near a large rock - thence running S. 68° W. about 13 rods to a heap of stones - thence S. 39° W. 15 rods to the end of a stone wall - thence S. 29° W. to a heap of stones by said wall - thence S. 39° W. about 14 rods to a heap of stones - thence S. 79° W. about 28 rods, to a heap of stones by a brook, called second brook - to the end of the wall by first brook, thence S. 65° W. about ten rods and a half - thence N. 78° W. about 20 $\frac{1}{2}$  rods, to a heap of stones by the road leading from Alex<sup>r</sup> Thayer's unto Caleb's hill, so called - all the before mentioned lines are by land of said Alex<sup>r</sup>. & son Thayer, near as the fence now stands - thence bounded westerly, northerly & westerly, by & with said road, until it comes to a corner of John Penimian's land, and abuts to land of Abag<sup>r</sup> Allen - then turning easterly, & bounding southerly, partly by said Allen, & partly by Nahum Whitlocks land, to a heap of stones by the fence on said Allen's house farm, then N. about 2° E. about 13 rods - thence N. 65° E. about 25 rods - thence N. 62° E. about 38 rods to stones by a walnut tree - thence N. 6° W. about 49 rods & a half to stones thence easterly, with a direct line to the double rock - thence with a direct line to Relicott's road - the last mentioned lines from Nahum Whitlocks land, are by land of Abag<sup>r</sup> Allen - thence crossing said road over to a corner, a little west of the spot where are the remains of the town's Pound on the north side of the mill road, so called - thence easterly, & northeasterly, by & with said road, until it comes to muddy brook, so called - thence running up stream of said brook, until it meets with the aforesaid second brook, so called - thence up stream of the last mentioned brook, to the above said Relicott's Road - thence crossing said road, to the first mentioned bound It being understood in the conveyance of the above described premises, that I reserve to my he<sup>r</sup> & Mother, Sarah Aldrich, her rights of dower & power of third in the aforesaid premises - And also liberty is reserved for Alex<sup>r</sup> Thayer, his heirs & assigns to pass & repass from his wood lot, south of said premises -
