Philson Elizabeth Know all men by these presents, that I, Elizabeth Philson, of Mendon, in the County of Worcester, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, widow, in consideration of four hundred and fifty dollars, paid by Gilbert Cook of said Mendon, yeoman, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do give, grant, sell and convey, unto the said Gilbert Cook, his heirs and assigns, a certain piece of land, situated in the Southerly part of said Mendon, on the Northerly side of the road leading from Bellingham to Mendon, containing two acres, fifty eight rods, more or less, with part of a dwelling house and out house thereon. Beginning at the Southeasterly corner of the premises at said road, and at corner of land set off to Ursula Cook as her right in the estate of Ariel Cook, deceased; thence running by land of said Ursula N. 20 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° W. through said house, nine rods six links to a stake and stones, and N. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. twenty eight rods, three links to land of the grantee, near a poplar tree marked; thence by land of the grantee as the wall stands, Northerly, Westerly, and Southerly to said road; then easterly by said road to the place of beginning, being the same premises set to me as my right in the estate of said deceased.

To have and to hold the afore-granted premises, to the said Gilbert Cook, his heirs and assigns, to his and their use and behoof forever. And I do for myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with the said Cook, his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the afore-granted premises, that they are free of all incumbrances; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Cook, and that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Cook, his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
