

Wheelock late of Mendon aforesaid, deceased, testate, including all real, personal, and mixed property, belonging to said estate, and including dower and homestead. Said Susan S. Wheelock is to have the use of the North tenement in the house on the homestead farm in Mendon till April 1st 1872, necessary fire-wood, subsistence out of the provisions now in said house, till April 1st 1872, all her clothing and wearing apparel, all the household furniture owned and claimed by her as her own separate property, and the use of a cooking stove till the first of April 1872.

The will is to be executed in her favor, as therein provided, and she is to be paid the sum of seven hundred dollars in ten months from date, without interest.

To have and to hold the same to the said Daniel and Andrus Wheelock their heirs and assigns, to them and their use and behoof forever. And I do covenant to warrant and defend said granted and quit-claimed premises to the said Daniel and Andrus Wheelock their heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons, claiming by or under me.

In witness whereof, I the said Susan S. Wheelock have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy one.
