And we do hereby for ourselves and our heirs executors and administrators covenant with the said grantee and his heirs and assigns that the granted premises are free from all incumbrances made or suffered by us; and that we will and our heirs executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said grantee and his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming by, through or under us but against none other. And for the consideration aforesaid I, Rodney A. Moore husband of said Susan Moore do hereby release unto the said grantee and his heirs and assigns all right to an estate by the curtesy in the granted premises; and for the consideration aforesaid I, Mary Daniels wife of said Leon Daniels do hereby release unto the said grantee and his heirs and assigns all right of or to both dower and homestead in the granted premises.
