

interest and all costs and expenses; paying the surplus, if any, to the Grantor or his assigns, and such sale shall forever bar the grantor and all persons claiming under him, from all right and interest in the premises, at law or in equity. It being mutually agreed, that the Grantee or their assigns may purchase at said sale, and that no other purchaser shall be answerable for the application of the purchase money. And provided also that, until some breach of the condition of this deed, the grantees shall have no right to enter and take possession of the premises.
