

and timber thereon lying on both sides of the Rehoboth Road formerly so called and bounded and described as follows, viz: Beginning at a heap of stones on the West side of said Rehoboth Road near a large rock; thence running $S. 63^{\circ} W$ about thirteen (13) rods to a heap of stones; thence $S. 39^{\circ} W$ fifteen (15) rods to the end of a stone wall; thence $S. 29^{\circ} W$ to a heap of stones by said wall; thence $S. 59^{\circ} W$ about fourteen (14) rods to a heap of stones; thence $S. 79^{\circ} W$ about twenty eight (28) rods to a heap of stones by a brook formerly called Second Brook now Spring Brook; thence $N. 81^{\circ} W$ about twenty and one half ($20\frac{1}{2}$) rods to the end of the wall by said brook; thence $S. 66^{\circ} W$ about ten and one half ($10\frac{1}{2}$) rods to a heap of stones by an old road now discontinued which led from the house formerly of Alexander Thayer to Caleb's Hill, so called. All the before mentioned lines are by land formerly of Alexander and William Thayer; thence bounded Westerly, Northerly and Westerly by and with said road, until it comes to a corner of land formerly of John Penniman, and also to land formerly of Ahaz Allen; then turning Easterly and bounding Southwesterly partly by land formerly of said Allen and partly by land formerly of Nahum Wheelock to a heap of stones by the fence on land formerly the home farm of said Ahaz Allen; then North about 2° East about thirteen (13) rods; thence $N. 65^{\circ} E$ about twenty five (25) rods; thence $N. 62^{\circ} E$ about thirty three (33) rods to stones; thence $N. 6^{\circ} W$ about forty nine and one half ($49\frac{1}{2}$) rods to stones; thence Easterly with a direct line to the double rock; thence with a direct line to said Rehoboth Road, the last mentioned lines from land formerly of Nahum Wheelock are by land formerly of Ahaz Allen; thence crossing said road to the corner of said Rehoboth Road and Mill Road, so called; thence Easterly and North Easterly by and with said Mill Road until it comes to Muddy Brook, so called; thence running up the stream of said brook until it meets with the aforesaid Second Brook, so called; thence up stream of the last mentioned brook to said Rehoboth Road; thence crossing said road to the first mentioned bound, and containing at
