I Jethro Coffin of Mendon in the County of Suffolk, and Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England Blacksmith being sick and weak but of sound and perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die and after death the Judgment To make & Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say, Principally and first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of God that gavel it And my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life after my just Debts & Funerall Expences are paid & discharged I give demise & dispose of the same in the following Manner and form Imp: To Mary my wellbelov'd wife I give (during her Natural life) the whole of the Innes & profits of all and singular of my Real Estate in what so ever the same shall or may be found; And that the whole of my Personal Estate shall be and remain with my said wife to be at her dispose forever, And that after the decease of my said Wife I give demise and dispose of the whole of my said Real Estate unto and amongst my six Children, Namely John Coffin, Jonah Coffin, & Robert Coffin, Margaret Perry, & Priscilla Gardner and Abigail Woodberry to them their heirs and assigns forever to be by them in equal distribution possessed & enjoyed as a true perfect & absolute Estate of Inheritance in Fee Simple Excepting three Acres of Land situate lying and being in Mendon aforesaid, which I did of late purchase of Woodland Thompson be the same more or less as it is abutted & bounded or reputed to be

bounded, which said three Acres of Land more or less I do hereby give unto my said Daughter Abigail Woodberry her heirs assigns forever overlaid and abdo her part & proportion in the Dividend and Distribution of my said Estate after the decease of my said wife as afore specified, And lastly I do hereby constitute make & Ordain Mary my wellbelov'd wife and my belov'd son John Coffin aforesaid to be my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament And I do hereby hereby Discharge Revok & Disannul all and every other of or by these Testaments Wills Legacies & Bequests, and Executors by me in any ways before made & Testaments in Testimony hereof I the said Jethro Coffin have here set to my hand and seal the day & year as within written Jethro Coffin & a seal signed sealed published pronounced & declared by the said Jethro Coffin at his last will & Testament in the presence of the Subscribers John Brown, Samuel Darling his + Mark Ebenezer Brown E B the mark of Exam: p John Boydell Reg.

August 10th 1726. Jethro Coffin Executor presented the foregoing will of his Father Jethro Coffin deceased, desiring that it might be proved and John Brown & Samuel Darling who were present and saw the said Jethro Coffin sign & seal and heard him publish & declare the said foregoing will to be his last will & Testament, and that when he so did he was of sound disposing mind and memory according to these Depoents best appearing, and that they together with Ebenezer Brown absent by reason of sickness set to their hands as witnesses thereof in the Testators presence
