after my decease by my son Nathan Gaskell and also one half of my  
household furniture.

I will give and bequeath to my Grandson Samuel Gaskell 2<sup>d</sup> son of  
Nathan Gaskell one thousand dollars to be paid him in six months after my  
decease by my son Nathan Gaskell.

I will give and bequeath to my Grandson Samuel P. Wilcox son of  
William Wilcox one hundred dollars to be paid him in six months after  
my decease by my son Nathan Gaskell.

And lastly I give legate and devise to my only son Nathan  
Gaskell all the rest, residue and remainder of my Real and personal  
estate & what, name or right, services, due, whatsoever situated to him the  
said Nathan Gaskell his heirs and executors executors and also the privilege  
herein named for said Nathan Gaskell and the farm given to Hannah  
Wilcox after her decease.

The said last will constitutes and appoints my son Nathan Gaskell  
to be the sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby reciting,  
all former wills by me made.

this my last Will and Testament this third day of January in the year  
of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty five.

Executor herein after named. And as to my worldly Estate. I dispose of the  
same as follows.

1<sup>st</sup> It is my will that all my just debts be paid and that my slaves  
be freed at the death of myself & my wife Rachel Haskell by my said  
Executor herein after named as soon as convenient after my decease  
I make no provision in this will for my funeral charges as they are to be  
paid by my Son Abram Haskell.

2<sup>d</sup> I give all my house hold furniture to my three daughters Emma  
Webster, Betsey Hayes and Prudence Vinton and their heirs to be equally  
divided between them, after my decease and the decease of my wife Rachel  
Haskell.

3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my Son Abram Haskell one dollar which taking  
into account what I have intended given him is his full share out of  
my Estate.

4<sup>th</sup> I give to my Grandson Samuel Haskell ten dollars to be paid  
him when he arrives at twenty one years of age with interest after my  
decease, if that takes place before his twentieth year.

5<sup>th</sup> I give to my Son George Haskell and his heirs one hundred dollars  
to be held by my son & Executor William Haskell in trust for said George  
and to be paid to him at the decease of said William my Executor.

6<sup>th</sup> I give to my Grandson Stephen Hobart twenty dollars to be paid  
him at my decease.

7<sup>th</sup> I give to my Son Samson Haskell one hundred and fifty dollars  
to be paid at my decease.

8<sup>th</sup> All the remainder of my real and personal Estate after paying  
the above mentioned legacies and bequests, I give to my Sons William  
Haskell, Samson Haskell and George Haskell, and to my daughters  
Clarissa Webster, Betsey Hayes and Prudence Vinton and their heirs  
to be equally divided between them at my decease.

And I hereby constitute and appoint my Son William Haskell  
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
