Know all men to whom these presents may come that I Relief Blooms of Shrewsbury in the County of Worcester County, disposing mind and memory do make and execute this instrument as and for my last Will and Testament.

1. I give and bequeath to my son John M. Blooms my desk and book case upon the same and one bed and bedstead and my red table cloth, and two diaper table cloths, marked with blue No 2. two bowls marked No 1 and 2, one large silver spoon to hold to him forever. I also give to Julia wife of the said John Henry Blooms all she should to hold to her forever.

2. I give and bequeath to the said John M. one bureau one bed, one table cloth marked with ink, two bowls marked No 2, one large silver spoon, one table cloth with fringe, in trust, nevertheless for the use and benefit of my son George P. Blooms and his wife and child or children and to be given to the said George P. or his heirs by the said John M. whenever he may see fit so to do.

4. I give and bequeath to my wife of the said George P. my cashmere shawl to hold to her forever.

3. I give and bequeath to the said John M. one hundred dollars in money, in trust nevertheless, for the benefit of Mary P. Blooms daughter of the said George P. the same to be put at interest and the principal and interest paid to her at the age of eighteen and in the event that she should die before that time then I order direct the same to be paid over to her heirs or legal representatives.

I also give and bequeath to the said Mary P. daughter of the said George P. one bureau with a wooden mirror my hanging looking glass with black and gilt frame, one bed and bedstead with foot board and my small white bed spread, patchwork bed quilt that was in the carpet up chamber, one comforter lined with yellow one pair fine sheets one pair fine pillow case, the red table cloth up chamber, half a dozen of my large silver tea spoons, the same to hold to her forever. I give and bequeath to my grandson Frederick M. Blooms my large bible & one bed, and to my grandson Henry P. Blooms one chest of dark color and to my grand son Henry P. Blooms one bed to hold to them forever.
