

Know all men by these presents

that I, Luther E. Taft, of Mendon, in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts,

in consideration of One Dollar and other valuable considerations, paid by Alfred W. White of Hopedale, in said County,

to

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby remise, release, and forever quitclaim unto the said Alfred W. White a certain parcel of land situated on the northeasterly shore of Nipmuck Pond, so called, in said MENDON, bounded as follows: Beginning at a stake at or near the shore of said pond, at land of Warren D. Stimpson; thence N. 69° 35' E., bounding on said Stimpson's land, about 92 feet to a stake at other land of grantor; thence N. 17° 35' W., 50 feet to a stake; thence S. 69° 35' W., about 90 feet to a stake at or near the shore of said pond; the last two lines bounding on grantor's other land; thence southerly, along the shore of said pond, about 50 feet to the point of beginning. With such rights of way, but none other, to and from the premises over an ancient town way along or near the shore of said pond, as I am entitled to grant. Reserving, however, to grantor and his heirs and assigns forever, a right of way over a portion of the granted premises two rods in width, measured from the high water line of the shore of said pond, with the further right to him and his heirs and assigns to dedicate said reservation to the public at any time. My title to the premises being derived by deed from my father, Ellis Taft, and by devise under the will of my uncle, George Taft.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Alfred W. White and his heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.

And I do hereby for myself and my heirs, executors, and administrators, covenant with the said grantee and his heirs and assigns that the granted premises are free from all incumbrances made or suffered by me, except as aforesaid,

and that I will, and my heirs, executors, and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said grantee and his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming by, through, or under me, except as aforesaid, but against none other.
