O'Donnell all of Milford, in the County of Worcester, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of One Dollar and other valuable considerations paid by John J. O'Sullivan of Mendon, in the County of Worcester aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby GIVE, BARGAIN, CONVEY unto the said John J. SELL, and O'Sullivan, two certain tracts of land situated in the easterly part of said MENDON with the buildings thereon, being part of the land formerly known as the Dexter Thayer Farm, and being on both sides of the Town road leading from the land formerly known as the Widow Robert Allen Farm, to land formerly of Daniel Larett; one of said tracts lying on northerly side of said road. Edmund O'Sullivan do hereby release unto the said grantee and his heirs and as-CURESTY DOWER signs all right of or to both and in the granted premises, all rights by statute and all other STEAD rights and interests therein.
