

THENCE Southerly by land belonging to Aaron Burdon to a heap of stones bounded easterly partly by land belonging to said Burdon and partly by land belonging to Marion Hall;

THENCE W esterly to the first mentioned bound bounded southerly partly by land of Aaron Burdon and partly by land belonging to said Daniels or however otherwise the same may be bounded.

Tract 6: A certain tract or parcel of land situated in the south parish in said Mendon containing by measurement two (2) acres and forty-five (45) rods, be the same more or less, bounded as follows:

BEGINNING at a heap of stones at land of the heirs of Timatha Alexander, Jr., it being the northwest corner of said two (2) acres and forty-five (45) rods;

THENCE E. 1° S. fourteen and six-tenths (14.6) rods to a heap of stones to land now or formerly of Thurber Warfield;

THENCE S. 5° E. twenty-three and two-tenths (23.2) rods to a heap of stones to land now or formerly of Elijah Thayer;

THENCE W. 10° S. fifteen and seven-tenths (15.7) rods to a heap of stones at land now or formerly of Rufus Darling;

THENCE N. 3 3/4° W. twenty-six (26) rods to the first mentioned bounds, the four lines bound on the heirs of Timatha Alexander, Jr., second on land of Thurber Warfield, third on land of Elijah Thayer, fourth on land of Rufus Darling and wife, now or formerly.

Tract 7: Also a certain parcel of woodland, containing ten (10) acres, more or less, situated in the southerly part of Mendon, in said County and Commonwealth, easterly of the road leading by the Arnold Taft place to Chestnut Hill, so-called, and about one hundred twenty-five (125) rods northeasterly of the shingle and saw mill formerly owned by the late Arnold Taft and bounded as follows, viz:

SOUTHERLY by land formerly of Heirs of Arnold Taft, now supposed of Lewis Taft;

EASTERLY by land formerly of Madison Staples;

NORTHERLY by lands of Willis Southwick and Heirs of Abel Aldrich and,

WESTERLY by land formerly of Varville Taft, or however otherwise bounded;

Said last four (4) tracts are the same premises as described in a deed from Sarah E. Gaskill to Eugene L. Jacob dated September 18, 1931, and recorded in said Worcester District Deeds, Book 2551, page 81.

Said premises are subject to highway location taking of town of Mendon recorded in said Registry of Deeds, August 30, 1937, in Book 2703, page 168.

Being all the same premises described in a Warranty Deed from Eugene L. Jacob to the Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation, recorded in Worcester County, Worcester District, Registry of Deeds on March 6, 1939, in Book 2740, page 412.

The above described premises are sold and conveyed subject to all easements and rights of way, if any, affecting them.

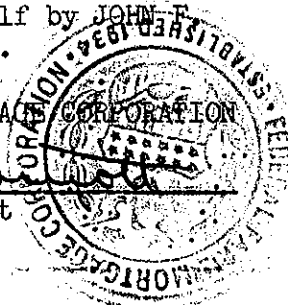
