Now all Men by these Presents

That I Margaret Seymour now of Northborough, in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts being of sound mind and memory, but knowing the uncertainty of this life, do this second day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, make and publish this, my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say:—

Firstly. I give bequeath and devise to my brother Joseph Seymour now of Shrewsbury in the County of Worcester, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, all the rest and remainder of my estate, real, personal, or mixed, which I may be possessed of at the time of my decease; the most of which I believe to have been, and now to be in the hands, or under the charge of Thomas Johnson, Notary Public of St. John, Canada East, hereby constituting my said brother Joseph Seymour my residuary Legatee and devisee.

Thirdly. I hereby constitute and appoint my said brother Joseph Seymour sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made.

This devise is intended to include any estate or interest in Lands which I may hereafter acquire.
