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I now all men by these presents that I, James Staples
of Mendon in the County of Worcester and common-
wealth of Massachusetts, yeoman, in consideration
of three hundred dollars paid by Alanson S. Freeman
of said Mendon, yeoman, the receipt whereof I do
hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell and
convey unto the said Alanson S. Freeman his heirs
and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land lying
in said Mendon and containing by estimation about
one eighth of an acre, be it the same more or less,
with a dwelling house and shoe makers shop stand-
ing thereon, with all the privileges and appurtenan-
ces thereto belonging, and bounded Beginning at the
South Easterly corner of an old corn crib that belongs to
Alanson S. Freeman at a town road leading from
Simeon Wheelock's to Benoni Staples: thence Westerly
about two rods to a wall and bounding Northerly on
Alanson S. Freeman's land; thence Southerly to the
town road aforesaid and bounding on land of Aus-
tin Fletcher as the wall and fence now stands:
thence Northerly on the aforesaid town road to the
place of beginning. To have and to hold the
afore granted premises to the said Alanson S. Free-
man his heirs and assigns to his and their use
and behoof forever. And I do for myself, my heirs, exec-
utors and administrators covenant with the said
Alanson S. Freeman his heirs and assigns that I
am lawfully seized, in fee of the afore granted prem-
ises: that they are free of all incumbrances: that I
have good right to sell and convey the same to the
said Alanson S. Freeman and that I will and my
heirs shall warrant and defend the same premises
