

Morris. Rufus. Know all men by these presents, that I, Rufus Morris, of Mendon, in the
county of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts - yeoman, in consid-
eration of Eleven hundred dollars, paid by David Adams, of said Mendon,
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell
and convey, unto the said David Adams, one undivided half of a certain tract
of land, with all the buildings standing thereon, situated in Mendon, on the
southerly side of the road leading from Milford to Uplridge, near the house
of Benjamin Davenport, Esq., containing by estimation, three acres more or
less, being the same premises wherein the grantor now resides and bound-
ed as follows. viz. Beginning at a point where the road leading from
the County Road, (formerly the Boston & Hartford Turnpike) meets the road
first mentioned, opposite the house of the aforesaid Benjamin Davenport -
thence running southerly, and bounded westerly by said first mention-
ed road, to a corner at land deeded this day by Thomas McAfee, to the
grantor - thence turning and running southeasterly, and bounded south-
westerly, by land this day conveyed to the grantor, by the said McAfee,
and by land formerly owned by the late blank book, to a point on the
northerly side of the aforesaid County Road, (formerly the Boston and
Hartford Turnpike) thence turning and running easterly, and bounded
southerly, by and with said last mentioned road, to the centre of a small
brook, at land of blank book - thence turning and running northwest-
erly, up the centre of said brook, and bounded easterly, on land of said
blank book to a corner, at a fence - thence turning and running easterly
and bounded southerly, on land of said book, to the Sheds of the Unit-
arian Meeting-house - thence turning and running northerly & easterly
by said Sheds and the common of said Meeting-house to a corner of
fence, at land of Phebe Aldrich, now occupied by Warren M. Aldrich - thence
turning and running northerly, and bounded southerly, by land of said
Phebe Aldrich, to a corner of fence - thence turning and running easterly
bounded southerly by land of said Phebe Aldrich, to a point on the road
leading from the Old County Road before mentioned, to the road first
mentioned, opposite the house of Benjamin Davenport - thence turning
and running westerly, by and with said road, to the first mention-
ed bound, at the place of beginning, together with all the privileges
and appurtenances to the same belonging. To have and to hold
the above-granted premises, with the privileges and appurtenances
thereto belonging, to the said David Adams, his heirs and assigns,
to his & their use and behoof forever. And I the said grantor, Rufus
Morris, for myself, and my heirs, executors and administrators, do con-
veyant with the said grantee, and his heirs and assigns, that I am law-
