


Know all men by these presents, that I, Holland Allbe  
 of Malpole in the county of Cheshire and state of  
 New Hampshire and Rosanna Allbe, wife of the  
 said Holland Allbe in consideration of nine hun-  
 dred and fifty dollars paid by Joanna Hinsley of  
 Mendon in the county of Worcester and Common-  
 wealth of Massachusetts, widow, the receipt, whereof  
 we do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell  
 and convey unto the said Joanna Hinsley, her heirs  
 and assigns, a certain tract of land situated in said  
 Mendon upon the southerly side of the road lead-  
 ing from Milford to Uxbridge, with all the buildings  
 thereon, together with all the privileges and appurte-  
 nances to the same belonging, and bounded as follows,  
 viz: Beginning at a point on said road at land of  
 Anna M. Hastings, thence South Westerly by and with  
 said road to the road leading to the County road  
 (formerly the Boston and Hartford turnpike) by  
 the houses of Catharine Taft and Marcus M. Aldrich  
 thence on said last mentioned road to a corner at  
 land of Catharine Taft, thence turning and run-  
 ning North Easterly as the slab fence now stands to  
 a corner of fence and wall at land of Ebenezer M.  
 Hayward, thence turning and running North West-  
 erly as the wall now stands and bounded North  
 Easterly by land of Ebenezer M. Hayward and Charles  
 H. Childs, to a corner of wall and picket fence at land  
 of Anna M. Hastings, thence turning & running South  
 Westerly as the picket fence now stands to a corner,  
 thence turning and running North Westerly as the  
 picket fence now stands to the road at the bound first  
 mentioned the last two lines bounding on land of Anna M.  
 Hastings, containing by estimation three fourths of an
