

Be it remembered, That on this seventeenth day of January, in the year  
of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and twenty one, it is agreed  
between Seth Hastings of Mendon, in the County of Worcester and Com-  
monwealth of Massachusetts, Esquire, and Ananias Gifford of Uxbridge,  
in said County and Commonwealth, yeoman, in manner and form fol-  
lowing, to wit, The said Ananias Gifford, for the consideration herein after  
mentioned, doth, for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators, covenant and  
agree with the said Seth Hastings, his executors, administrators and assigns,  
that he the said Gifford shall and will within the space of Ten Months  
next after the date hereof, in a good and workman like manner in Mendon afre-  
= said, on the ground where the John Hill-House (so called) formerly stood, well and  
substantially erect, build and finish one House, according to the draught or scheme  
hereunto annexed, of the dimensions following, viz. The said House to be Thirty eight  
feet long and twenty five feet and four inches wide; with the addition of an  
Ell eighteen feet long and fourteen feet wide: said house to stand square with  
the road which passes by said House: - All the walls of said house to be built of  
good merchantable Bricks, suitable & proper for building a house: - The walls of said  
house on the lower story to be one foot thick, and the upper story and Ell  
to be eight inches thick; said walls to be sixteen feet high for the house,  
and eight feet high for the Ell; all said walls to be faced with Inch boards:  
to be placed in said House and Ell, twenty five windows of twenty lights each,  
one of twelve lights, four windows of eight lights each, and three cellar windows of  
four lights each, also lights over the front door of said house, all said lights to be  
seven by nine of Bristol Brown Glaz: to be a cellar under the whole of the  
upright part of said House seven feet deep, well <sup>under</sup>~~under~~<sup>with a drain from the cellar</sup> panted, and a convenient  
out-side cellar door: - The front of said House to be under pined with good  
handsome hewn stones eighteen inches wide and of a suitable & proper length, the  
remaining part of the under pining stones to be suitable & proper, and may be taken from  
the old cellar wall if suitable, or dug or blown down said Hastings land, both said under pining last mentioned & the cellar  
walls: To be two handsome door stones at the front door, and one good door stone at  
each of the other outside doors: - To be jets on said House nine inches each  
cased with a plane cornice, and a cornice under the eves of the Ell without  
any jet: - Said House to be shingled with good Merchantable <sup>pine</sup> Shingles

all the wood-work of the out-side of said Building (except the roof) to be  
well painted with three coats of white lead paint: - To be four outside doors  
to the house and Ell: the inside of the House to be proportioned according to  
the plan hereunto annexed: - All the floors to be laid double; the floor in the  
lower part of the House to be laid with good clear Chestnut boards or  
yellow pine boards, that shall be equally as good: The Chamber & Garret  
floors may be laid with good white pine boards: - To be one Chimney in  
the East-end of said house, with one fire place in the lower part and one  
in the chamber over it; also one Chimney in the west end with one fire  
place and oven below and one fire place in the Chamber above: also  
to be one fire place and oven in the Ell with the addition of setting a  
large kettle in which to boil potatoes etc: - The window sashes to be made  
of good clear eastern pine; all the windows to be cased with plain casings;  
the inside doors to be panelled without mouldings: The outside doors to be  
panelled with mouldings, and to be made of good pine plank: The front  
rooms and the two small rooms joining the Stairway, and the Ell, to be
