I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Mary A. Bartlett, one undivided third part of all the real and real due of my estate.

I give devise and bequeath to my son Lewis A. Davenport, one undivided third part of all the real and real due of my estate.

I give devise and bequeath to Aaron B. Mayhew of Milford one undivided third part of all the real and real due of my estate, to be held by him, in trust, for the use and benefit of my son Edward A. Davenport, during his natural life, unless my said son should request said Aaron B. Mayhew in writing to convey the same estate to him absolutely, and in case he should make such request I hereby direct the said Aaron B. Mayhew to make a conveyance according to said request, and in case of the death of my said son without said request being made, I direct the said Aaron B. Mayhew to convey or pay over said estate to the family of my said son Edward, in the same proportions as they would have been entitled to the same, in case my said son had died the legal owner thereof.
