Know all men by these presents, that I, George Wood, of Mendon, in the County of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, in consideration of Two hundred dollars, paid by Perry Wood and Austin Wood, both of said Mendon, the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell and convey, unto the said George Wood, his heirs and assigns, a certain tract of land, situated in said Mendon, upon the westerly side of the road leading from the house of Welcome Staples, to the road to Northbridge and bounded as follows. viz. Beginning at a point, upon the westerly side of the said road, at the N. E. corner of land improved by Elisha Wood, thence by and with said road, northwesterly to land of Otis Thayer, thence S. 45° W. 49 rods and 20 links, & bounded northwesterly by said Thayer's land, thence S. 30° E. 8 rods - thence S. 33 $\frac{3}{4}$ ° E. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  rods - thence S. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. 63 rods to a corner, the three last lines bounding on land of Ch. L. Cook, the heirs of Clark Cook, and the land of Elijah Lee, thence turning & running N. 46 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E. 43 rods & 14 links, bounding southerly on land improved by Elisha Wood aforesaid, to the first mentioned bound containing 1 $\frac{1}{4}$  acres and 43 rods, he and the same more or less, being the same tract of land conveyed to me by a deed of quit-claim by the said Perry and Austin, of even date with this instrument.
