

the fee act and deed of the Clinton Savings Bank

Cornwell Hannah S. I know all men by these presents, that I, Hannah S.,  
to Cornwell of Clendron, in the county of Worcester and Commonwealth  
Charlotte T. Cornwell & } of Massachusetts, in consideration of One Dollar and other val-  
uable considerations paid by Charlotte Taft Cornwell and Amy B.  
Cornwell, daughters of said Hannah S. and Jacob Cornwell, all  
of said Clendron, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby  
by give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Charlotte  
Taft Cornwell and Amy B. Cornwell, the homestead farm  
now occupied by the said Hannah S. and Jacob Cornwell, con-  
sisting of about eight acres and the farm buildings thereon, situated  
in the Southwesterly part of said Clendron and more particularly de-  
scribed in the deed of George Mowry to Arnold Aldrich, dated  
Oct. 6, 1870, and recorded in the Registry of Deeds at Worcester, Book  
826 Page 123, and in the deed of Loring A. Adams and others, heirs  
at law of said Arnold Aldrich to Diana A. Aldrich, dated Nov. 21,  
1872, and recorded in the Registry of Deeds, at Worcester, Book  
886 Page 343, to which deeds reference may be had for metes  
and bounds. It being the same premises conveyed by deed of Di-  
ana A. Aldrich to Hannah S. Cornwell, dated April 12, 1876 and  
recorded in Worcester District Deeds, Book 981 Page 318.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the  
privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Char-  
lotte Taft Cornwell and Amy B. Cornwell and their heirs and  
assigns to their own use and behoof forever. And I do hereby, for  
myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with  
the said grantees and their heirs and assigns that I am lawfully  
seized in fee simple of the granted premises, that they are free from  
all incumbrances, that I have good right to sell and convey the same  
as aforesaid; and that I will and my heirs, executors and admin-  
istrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said grantees  
and their heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims  
and demands of all persons. And for the consideration aforesaid I,  
Jacob Cornwell, husband of the said Hannah S. Cornwell, do  
hereby release unto the said grantees and their heirs and assigns  
all right in the granted premises, whether obtained by the cur-  
tesy or however otherwise obtained.
