Know all men by these presents  
that we Joseph M. Wood and wife Angelina A.  
Chas. H. Howe, Wood, in my own right, both of Mendon in the  
Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration

release and forever quitclaim unto the said

on the Easterly side of the road leading from  
Milford to Woonsocket and bounded as follows.  
Northerly by land of one ~~H~~unnewell, C. P. Burr and  
J. P. Bicknell; Easterly by land of Joseph Bates;  
Southerly by land of James Newhall and Ellis  
Bullard and West by said road. Said farm  
contains about 46 acres be the same more or less.

To have and to hold the granted

and his heirs and assigns to their own use and  
behoof forever. And we do hereby for ourselves  
and our heirs executors and administrators  
covenant with the said Grantee and his heirs  
and assigns that the granted premises are free  
from all incumbrances made or suffered by us  
except a certain mortgage for Six Hundred Dollars  
to J. P. Bicknell on the whole of said property.  
and that we will and our heirs executors and  
administrators shall warrant and defend the  
same to the said Grantee and his heirs and  
assigns forever against the lawful claims and  
demands of all persons claiming by through or  
under us except as above stated but against  
none other.
