Bromb of said Mendon, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said George P. Bromb a certain tract of pasture and upland containing about four acres, situated in said Mendon and bounded Northerly by land this day conveyed by grantor to Elbert W. Gross as a location proposed for the Milford and Uxbridge Street Railway, bounded Southwesterly by land of Luther E. Taft, and Easterly and Northerly by land of grantee. Being that part of the premises conveyed by deed of S. Warren book Executor to Henry W. Gaskill dat- June 16th 1899 and recorded with Worcester District Deeds Book 1617 Page 364, situated Southerly of the tract conveyed to said Gross and my title being derived by deed from said Gaskill. Said premises are conveyed subject to the agreement relative to fencing between the granted premises and the premises conveyed to said Gross as is set forth in said Gross deed.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said George P. Bromb and his heirs and assigns to their own use and behoof forever. And I do hereby for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators covenant with the said grantee and his heirs and assigns that the granted premises are free from all incumbrances made or suffered by me except as aforesaid, and that I will and my heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said grantee and his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons claiming by, through or under me except as aforesaid but against none other.
