Know all men by these presents that I Catherine Smith of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts widow in consideration of three hundred and sixty seven dollars paid by Seth Hastings of said Mendon Esquire the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Seth Hastings his heirs and assigns the three following described tracts of land, the first tract of land is situated Northerly of the Friends Meeting house in the first Parish in said Mendon containing ten acres and thirty nine rods bounded as follows to wit. beginning at a heap of stones on the North side of the wall near a large walnut tree being the Southwest corner, and a corner of Matee Davenport's land, then North  $21\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West by and with the said Matee's land about sixty rods to a heap of stones being the Northwest corner, then East about  $39^{\circ}$  North thirty rods by and with said Matee's land to a stake at Muddy brook (so called) being the Northeastly corner, then turning & running down stream by and with the middle of said brook, to a heap of stones at land formerly Essek Aldrich's but now owned by Samuel Gaskill, then West  $32\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  South about seventeen rods to a heap of stones by a stone wall, then South about  $16^{\circ}$  East thirty six rods to the corner of a stone wall thence by said stone wall about seven rods to the turnpike road, this line bounding Easterly on said Samuel Gaskill land formerly Essek Aldrich's land, then westerly by and with said turnpike road to the bounds first mentioned with all the buildings standing on said land, the whole being a part of the homestead farm of Luke Aldrich late of said Mendon deceased.

The other tract being a piece of woodland adjoining what was Essek Aldrich's woodlot but now owned by Alexander Jones, situate in Milford in said County and North of where the Saul Ramsdell house stood bounded as follows to wit beginning at a heap of stones being the Northwest corner on the Easterly side of the eight rod road, so called, and the southwest corner of land formerly Essek Aldrich's, but now belonging to Alexander Jones thence  $25^{\circ}$  North by and with said Alexander Jones formerly said Essek Aldrich's land seventy five rods to a heap of stones at Peter Cook's land being the Northeast corner, thence South  $36^{\circ}$  East about twenty rods to a heap of stones to Henry Chapin's land and a corner of Peter Cook's land being the Southeast corner, then West  $22^{\circ}$  South by said Henry Chapin's land about thirteen rods to a heap of stones then South  $22^{\circ}$  East ten rods to a heap of stones then West  $22^{\circ}$  South about sixty two rods to a heap of stones by said eight rod road, being the southwest corner thence Northerly by and with said road, to the first mentioned bounds containing twelve acres and eight rods. — The third piece being pasture land containing thirty three acres & forty five rods, bounded as follows, to wit.
