

at a heap of stones on the old Hartford Turnpike road at the Southeast corner of land belonging to Nathan George of said Mendon and running Northerly with said George's land as the wall now stands to a corner thence turning Easterly with said George's land as the fence and wall now stand to a corner thence turning Northerly with said George's land as the fence now stands to land of Silas Dudley of said Mendon then same course with said Dudley's land to a corner then turning Easterly with said Dudley's land as the wall and fence now stand to the centre of muddy brook (so called) then turning Southerly with centre of said brook and running to land of Samuel Gaskiel of said Mendon then turning Westerly with said Gaskiel's land to a corner as the fence and wall now then turning Southerly by said Gaskiel's land as the fence ~~now~~ now stands to the old Hartford Turnpike road then turning West with said road to the first mentioned bound at the corner of said George's land —

The second tract of land is known as the upper graft lot and contains about one acre and seventy two rods more or less and is bounded on the North by the old Turnpike road on the West by the Friends meeting house yard on the South and East by town roads —

The third tract of land is known as the lower graft lot and contains about two and a half acres more or less and is bounded on the North by the old Turnpike road on the West by a town road on the South and East by land of Samuel Gaskiel as the fence now stands —

The fourth tract is pasture land situated in said Mendon and is bounded as follows Beginning at a heap of stones on the eight rod road (so called) at the Southeast corner of land belonging to Amaria Taft of said Mendon and running with said Taft's land as the fence and wall now stand Westerly to a town road near the old George Aldrich house (so called) then turning Southerly with said road and running to land of William Burk then turning Easterly with said Burk's land as the wall now stands to a corner then turning Southerly with said Burk's land as the fence now stands to a corner then turning Easterly with said Burk's land as the fence and wall now stand to the eight rod road then turning Northerly by said road running to the first mentioned bound at the Southeast corner of said Taft's land containing about thirty three acres more or less —

The fifth tract is woodland and is situated in said Mendon on the old eight rod road and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a heap of stones on the eight rod road at the Southeast corner of land belonging to the heirs of Seth
