Williams his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons. - In witness whereof I the said Benjamin Williams & Patsy Williams his wife in testimony of quitting my right of dower in said premises have hereunto set our hands and seals, this sixth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight Hundred and forty four.
