hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell  
and convey unto the said Harvey A. Macuen and George  
L. Macuen, a certain tract or parcel of land with  
buildings thereon, known as the Moses Aldrich Place,  
and situated on the Northerly side of the old Boston  
and Hartford Turnpike in the Westerly part of said  
Mendon and bounded as follows: Beginning at a  
stone in the middle of the brook near a bridge across  
the same in said Turnpike; thence N. 33° E. 34 rods  
and twenty links by the center of said ditch or  
brook to a stake and bounding Easterly by land  
formerly of Perry Wood; thence N. 78<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>° W. 18 rods and 9
