William S. Goddard.

I know all men by these presents, that I William S. Goddard, of Royalton, in the County of Worcester, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and declare this my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all former wills, at any time heretofore made by me.

First. It is my will, that all my just debts and burial

charges, and also the necessary expenses of a suitable monument or appropriate grave stone, to be erected at my grave, be paid out of my estate.

Second. I give and bequeath, to my mother Betsey Goddard, if then living, Two dollars, for each of my brother and sister viz:

Charles, Franklin &c, Sally Wheeler, Mary Ann Cheney, and Elizabeth Knapp, Two dollars. Or if any of them are not then living, to their heirs, if any, by right of representation.

Third. I give, bequeath, and devise, to my beloved wife, Fanny E. Goddard, all the real and residue of my estate whether the same may be real, or personal, of whatsoever description the same may be and wherever situated, of which I may die seized or succeeded, or to which I may be entitled at the time of my death. To have and to hold in her own right as fully and fully as I now possess and enjoy the same. To her and to hold the same to her and her heirs forever, with full power to keep sell and convey or otherwise dispose of the same, in such way as may best suit her interest and convenience. And I hereby authorize and empower, my said wife, to make either public or private sale of any or all of my estate, that may be necessary to carry out the provisions of my will, and to make and execute all necessary papers to carry the same in writing, without the intervention of any Court.

Fourth. I hereby appoint my beloved wife, Fanny E. Goddard, Executrix, of this my last will and testament.

Provided however, that if my said wife, Fanny E. Goddard, shall not be living at the time of my decease, then and in that case, I give, devise, and bequeath my property, after paying my just debts, burial charges and for a monument or grave stone, as aforesaid, as follows, to wit:

Fifth. I give to my Mother, Betsey Goddard, Two dollars, if living at my decease, to my brother Franklin &c, and to my sisters Sally Wheeler, and Mary Ann Cheney, each Two dollars, or to their heirs by right of representation as aforesaid.

Sixth. I give to my sister, Elizabeth Knapp, Four hundred dollars, in her own right.

Seventh. I give to my Father-in-Law, Taylor Carl, One thousand dollars, for his own use and his heirs forever.

Eighth. I give to John N. Carllet, of said Royalton, One thousand dollars, to be held in trust for the benefit of my brother Charles Goddard, and I direct my said Trustee, to safely invest said funds, according to his best judgment and pay over the income annually, to my said brother Charles.
