I, Augusta Karpowicz, of Mendon, Worcester County, Massachusetts, for consideration paid, grant to Frank Ernas and Wladislaw Ernas, both of Cambridge, Middlesex County, Massachusetts, with QUITCLAIM covenants each one undivided half interest as tenants in common three tracts of land in said MENDON as follows: The first tract with the dwelling house and all other buildings thereon being all of the first tract which was conveyed to William A. Armitage et ux. by George R. Whiting by deed dated November 18, 1926, recorded with Worcester District Deeds, Book 2422, Page 496, and bounded and described therein as follows: Beginning at corner of stone wall at the junction of the old Boston & Hartford Turnpike with the road leading from residence formerly of Lewis B.Gaskill to Woonsocket; thence along the southerly line of Turnpike westerly to a large elm tree; thence same course but bounded northerly by land formerly of Benjamin D.
