

Phetteplace for & in consideration of the aforesaid sum of money, paid to my said husband, do hereby remise, release & forever quitclaim unto the said Liberty Goss, his heirs & assigns, all my right of Dower & Power of thirds in and to the above described premises. In testimony whereof, we have hereunto set our hands and seals this fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four. (1844.)

Brigham Anna Know all men by these presents, that I, Anna Brigham, of Westborough, in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, widow in consideration of one dollar paid me by Lyant Fay, of Southborough, in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby grant, sell and quit claim unto the said Lyant Fay, all my right, title, claim, and demand in and unto all right or, possibility of right to dower in a certain part of a farm in said Southborough of which Robert Fay of said Southborough, died seized and possessed; being one undivided twelfth part of that portion of said farm which was set off and assigned to his widow Utnit Fay, as her dower, which land so sett off and assigned as aforesaid contains about thirty six acres with a part of a house and part of a barn and other buildings thereon, situated in the easterly part of said Southborough, lying on both sides of the road leading from the center of said Southborough to Faysville. For a more particular description of the premises, reference is had to the return of the commissioners who set out said dower, recorded in the Probate Office at Worcester, July the second A.D. eighteen hundred and eleven.
