This Indenture, of two parts, made & executed on this fifteenth day of July, in
the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred & thirty six, by & between Enos
Goss, of Providence, in the State of Rhode Island, Merchant, of the first part;
& Jacob Ide, of Medway, David A. Grosvenor & William C. Capron, both of Ux-
bridge, Peter Rockwood, of Milford & Paul Whiting, of Northbridge, all of the
Commonwealth of Massachusetts, of the second part. Witnesseth, That the
said Enos Goss, the party of the first part, as aforesaid, in consideration of
the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars to him paid by the said parties of
the second part, doth by these presents, give, grant, bargain, sell & convey
unto them the said Ide, Grosvenor, Capron, Rockwood & Whiting, the parties
of the second part as aforesaid, all that certain lot of land situated in Men-
don, in the County of Worcester & Commonwealth of Massachusetts, on the
West side of the highway leading from Providence to Worcester, & bounded &
described as follows, viz.: Beginning at the Northeast corner of land now
or late of Almanza Tufts; thence running Westerly bounding Southerly
by said Tufts land, sixty four feet; thence turning nearly at a right
angle, & running Northerly forty feet; thence turning nearly at a right
angle & running Easterly sixty four feet to said highway; thence on said
^{highway to said} Northeast corner of said Tufts land, (the first mentioned bound) forty feet,
or however otherwise the same may be measured or bounded; being the
whole lot of land whereon a house of Public Worship now stands, together
with all the rights, easements, privileges & appurtenances thereunto belonging,
& more especially the right, privilege & liberty of entering upon certain ad-
joining land, as described & conveyed unto the said Enos Goss, by the deed of
Anna Childs, dated January 16th A.D. 1830, & herewith delivered to be recorded.

To have and to hold all the afore-granted premises unto them the said
Jacob Ide, David A. Grosvenor, William C. Capron, Peter Rockwood & Paul
Whiting, & the survivors & survivor of them, & the heirs and assigns of such
survivor: In trust, nevertheless, & to & for the uses & purposes following,
none other, to wit: In the first place, to permit the Evangelical Society,
in the First Parish, Mendon, & the church connected with the same, to
use the aforegranted premises, & to take the rents & profits thereof, so long,
in such manner & on such conditions, all as particularly set forth in the
votes of the said Evangelical Society of & concerning the same, passed at
their meeting of January 21st A.D. 1830, to which votes reference is to be had
herewith, & a certified copy whereof is hereunto annexed, as a part of these
presents.

In the second place, on the default of the said
Evangelical Society & the church aforesaid, in complying with & fully perform-
