Seth Davenport vs

I know all men by their presents that I Otis —
Ammidon of Providence in the County of Providence & State
of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations Merchant in
consideration of Four Thousand eight hundred and fifteen
dollars paid by Seth Davenport of Mendon in the County of
Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts Yeoman and
Seth Hastings of the same Mendon Esquire the receipt
whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant full
and convey unto the said Seth Davenport and Seth Hastings
their heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of
land situated and lying in said Mendon containing by Esti-
mation Sixty acres the same more or less and bounded as
follows (viz) Beginning at the Northwesterly corner of said
tract by the road leading from Worcester to Providence and at
the head of the road leading from the Hartford road to Milford
then running Easterly according to the course of said road lead-
ing to Milford until it comes to land owned by William
Fitzger and bounding Northwesterly on said road then turn-
ing and running Southeastwesterly on the fence now stand till
it comes to Luke Aldrichs land and bounding Easterly
upon land belonging to said William F. Mege then
turning and running Southeastwesterly on the fence now stand
about forty five rods and bounding Southerly upon Luke
Aldrichs land then turning and running Southeastwesterly on the
fence now stand until it comes to land owned by Richard
George and bounding Easterly upon Luke Aldrichs land
then turning and running Southeastwesterly until it strikes the
end of a partition wall upon said Richard Georges line and
then on the same course as said wall stands to the turnpike
road and bounding Southerly upon said Richard Georges
land then turning and running Northwesterly according to the
course of the road leading from Providence to Worcester to the
bound first mentioned with all the buildings situated stand-
ing and lying on said premises together with all premi-
ses
