To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said Seth Davenport and Seth Hastings their heirs and assigns to their use and behoof forever and I do covenant with the said Seth Davenport and Seth Hastings and each of them their heirs and assigns and each of them that I am lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises that they are free of all incumbrances that I have good right to full & plenary the same to the said Seth Davenport and Seth Hastings & that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the s^r Seth Davenport and Seth Hastings & each of them their heirs and assigns and each of them forever against the lawful claims & demands of all persons In witness whereof I the said Stephen Ammidon have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four —
