Aldrich To all people to whom these presents shall come I hope Aldrich and Samuell Thayer
 both of whom are in County of Worcester in province of Massachusett Bay Common
 Senthgating know ye that we the said Ingers Aldrich & Samuell Thayer for and in consideration
 of Ten pounds Lawfull money being in hand already had and well and timely paid by George
 Aldrich Joseph Allin and George Smith all of said town of Common as their meagents for and each
 city or body of Christian people within said province called and known by name of Quakers
 the said sum paid being upon monies of said Society, the Raising whereof we hereby
 acknowledge and on this to be therewith fully satisfied and contented and know by ^{and their neigbor}
 every just and possible charge do & concurate against the said George Aldrich
 These presents have been granted bargained and sold & confirmed & by these
 presents for and to us and our heirs do fully freely and absolutely give grant bargained
 convey & confirm unto the said George Aldrich Joseph Allin and George Smith & to their heirs
 next & then living in town on Rens^t containing about half an acre bounded on
 South and North side with highways and last with land of said Ingers Aldrich and on
 the West with land of said Samuell Thayer and in same lot wherein the publick
 meeting house of said Christian people called friends now standeth and contains
 the whole lot now enclosed within the fence whereand to hold the said lot of
 land with the appurtenances priviledges & Conveniencies to same belonging or
 any wife appertaining to them the said George Aldrich Joseph Allin & George Smith
 their heirs forever upon trust that the Society of Christian people known by
 the name of Quakers shall have like and receive the whole profits use & improv-
 ement of the said lot of land and all its appurtenances in all time to come and that the
 said Society and their successors, always hereafter shall use & direct the same
 the best improvement thereof in such way as to them shall seem best for my publick
 welfare & of said Society in method and after such manner as is used and customa-
 ry for said Society of Christian people called Quakers to govern divers manage-
 ment temporal & private affairs but shall not appropriate of said lot or any part
 thereof to any private use or purpose what so ever and we will in our Aldrich &
 Land Thayer for our selves and heirs & ours and our¹ do covv¹ & prouideing to
 and with the said George Aldrich Joseph Allin and George Smith and their heirs —
