George Cemetery Corporation

Know all men by these presents that we Natham R. George, Melissa U. George Julius A. George, Abbie F. George Nancy C. George, Natham R. George Jr. and Melissa B. George all of Mendon in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Rosanna F. Taft and Arthur R. Taft both of Uxbridge in said Commonwealth and Herbert G. George and Lena H. George both of Melrose in said Commonwealth, in consideration of One dollar and other valuable considerations paid by the George Cemetery Corporation a corporation duly organized under the laws of said Commonwealth for cemetery purposes and with its property situated in said Mendon the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George Cemetery Corporation a certain parcel of land containing fifty-four and forty-five one hundredths square rods more or less, situated in the central village of said Mendon and bounded and described as follows, namely, Beginning at a corner of land formerly of Benjamin D. Williams on the road leading by the former dwelling house of said Williams, thence on said road S. 72 deg. 15 min. W. 7 rods and 7 links to a corner of stone walls at land of said Natham R. George, thence N. 17 deg. 45 min. W. 7 rods and 12 links, with a stone wall and by land of said George to corner of walls thence N. 72 deg. 15 min. E. 7 rods and 7 links with wall by said George's land to a corner of walls at said Williams' land thence S. 17 deg. 45 min. E. 7 rods and 12 links with wall by said Williams' land to the point of beginning, the same being now used for cemetery purposes and being that tract excepted in the deed
