Furthermore I the said Benjamin Dudley for myself my heirs Executors, and Administrators, do covenant and engage the above dimised premises to him the said Samuel Dudley and his heirs and assigns, against the lawful claims and demands of any person, or persons, whatsoever, forever hereafter to warrant, secure and defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Benjamin Dudley & Mercy his wife in token of relinquishing her right of dower of thirds in the premises and consenting to the sale of the same have each of them set their hands and seals this eighth day of August in the year of our Lord Anno Domini 1789.
