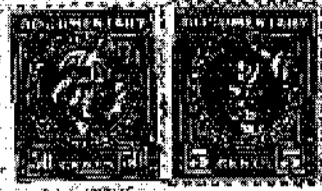


For our title see Deed of Reuben B. Rowe to us, dated May 21, 1914, and recorded with Worcester District Deeds, Book 2049, Page 499.
