A certain tract or parcel of land situated on the easterly side of Glenn Avenue, formerly called the road leading from near the Mills of the Upton Manufacturing Company to Northbridge, passing the Farrow place, so-called, in said Upton, and being more particularly bounded and described as follows, to wit:-

Beginning at an iron pipe on the easterly side of said Glenn Avenue and at the southwest corner of land of one Frank Dow, formerly of the Upton Manufacturing Company thence S. 23° 30' W. by the easterly side of said Avenue 100.0 feet to an iron pipe; thence S. 66° E. by remaining land of the grantors 100.2 feet to an iron pipe at or near the bank of the West River; thence continuing the same course 16.8 feet, more or less, to the center line of said river; thence northerly (up stream) by the center line of said river 119 feet, more or less, to land of said Frank Dow; thence N. 66° W. 14.3 feet, more or less, to an iron pipe at or near the bank of said river; thence continuing the same course 50.7 feet to the iron pipe at the point of beginning.
