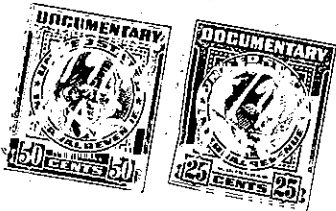

"A certain tract of land situated in said Mendon, near the shore of Mendon or Nipmuck Pond, as the same may be called, and bounded as follows:—beginning at the north-westerly corner of the granted premises the same being the northeasterly corner of land now owned by this grantor said point being 100 feet from the shore of the pond, measured on a line running N. 69° 33' E.; thence running with said course and bounding on land of one White 100 feet to a stake; thence turning and running S. 17° 35' E. with other land of the grantor, 30 feet to a drill-hole in a rock; thence S. 69° 35' W. with other land of the grantor, 100 feet to a stake at the southeasterly corner of said grantee's land; thence N. 17° 35' W. 50 feet to the point of beginning."
