fifty eight & interest on the same after the first day of April 1855. then this deed as also one
written note bearing date with these presents given by the said Leonara Walker to the said
David Sibley to pay the same sum & interest at the time aforesaid shall be void otherwise
shall remain in full force. In witness whereof I the said Leonara Walker have here-
unto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of August in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and fifty four.

convey unto the said William B. Bates his heirs and assigns the following tract and parcel
of land situated in the easterly part of said Mendon containing eleven acres and seventy
four rods more or less and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at the northwest corner of
the premises on a town road thence on Grantees land by a stone wall N 86^{deg} E. thirty seven
rods and twenty two links to land of Caleb Adams thence S. 8^{deg} E. thirty four rods thence S
28^{deg} W one rod & ten links thence S 1^{deg} E. eleven rods & two links the three last courses boun-
ded by a wall on land of said Caleb Adams. Thence N 88^{deg} W sixteen rods thence S 88^{deg} W
twenty six rods & eighteen links the last two courses bounded by a wall on grantor's land
thence N 14^{deg} E. forty five rods and seventeen links by said town road to the first mentioned
bound.
