Know all men by these presents that I Dexter Rice of Groton in  
the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in  
consideration of four hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by John F.  
Pearl of Southborough in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth  
aforesaid Shoemaker the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged do  
hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John F.  
Pearl his heirs and assigns a certain parcel of land with a dwel-  
ling house thereon situate in that part of said Southborough  
called Southville, containing forty rods more or less and is bou-  
nded as follows to wit. Beginning at the road leading from Sou-  
thville to Westborough at land of Harvey Newton, thence running  
Easterly five rods by said road to a stake and stones, thence  
Southerly by land I this day conveyed to Heiram J. Carr to a  
stake and stones at land of Joseph Boyd, thence Westerly five  
rods by land of said Boyd to land of said Newton, thence Nor-  
therly by land of said Newton eight rods to the place of beginn-  
ing. Together with a right to get water from the well on the  
premises adjoining this on the East side. the said Pearl his  
heirs or assigns to pay one half the expense in keeping said  
well and wooden pump in order and also a right to enter said  
premises adjoining this on the East, which premises I have this  
day conveyed to Heiram J. Carr, to relay or repair the pipe lead-  
ing to said well.

To have and to hold the above gran-  
ted premises with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto  
belonging to the said John F. Pearl his heirs and assigns to his  
and their use and behoof forever. And I the said Dexter Rice for  
myself and my heirs executors and administrators do covenant  
with said John F. Pearl his heirs and assigns that I am lawfully  
seized in fee simple of the afore granted premises, that they are  
free from all incumbrances, that I have good right to sell and
