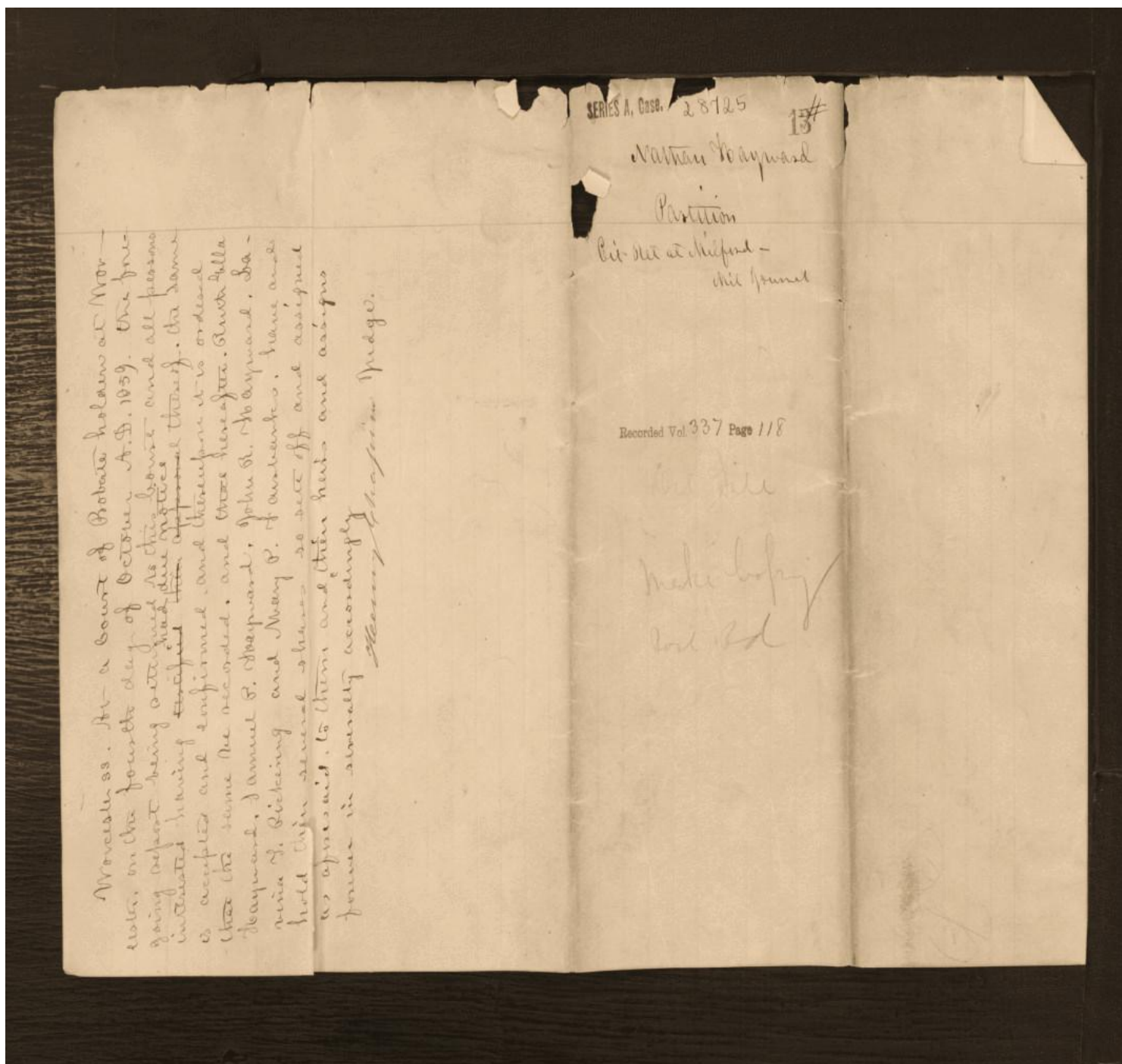

Hayward, James P. Hayward & Lucina S. Peckham. It being her share as devised in the last will of Nathl. Hayward late of Hudson. To have of that portion set off as above to her Hayward.

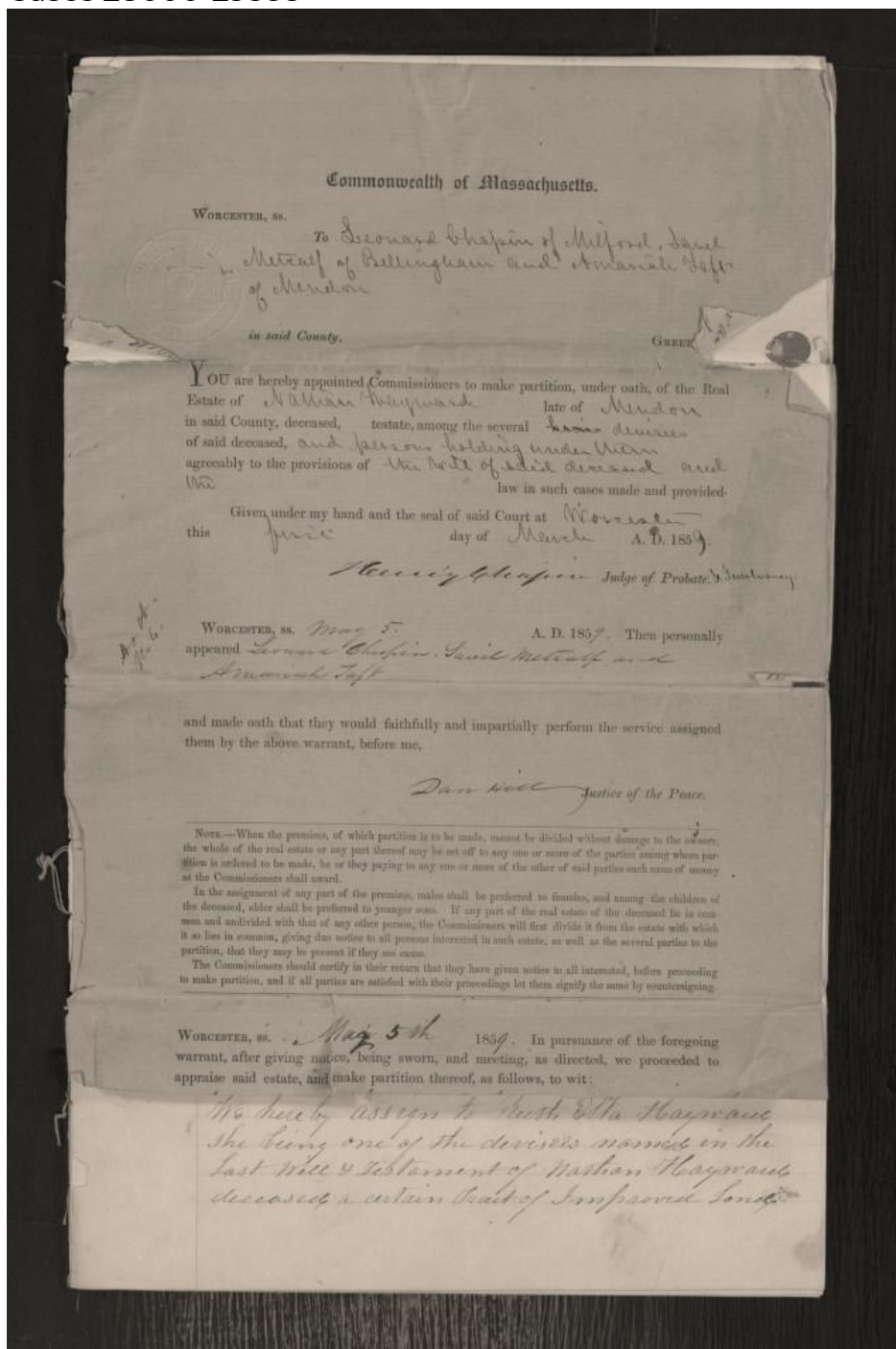

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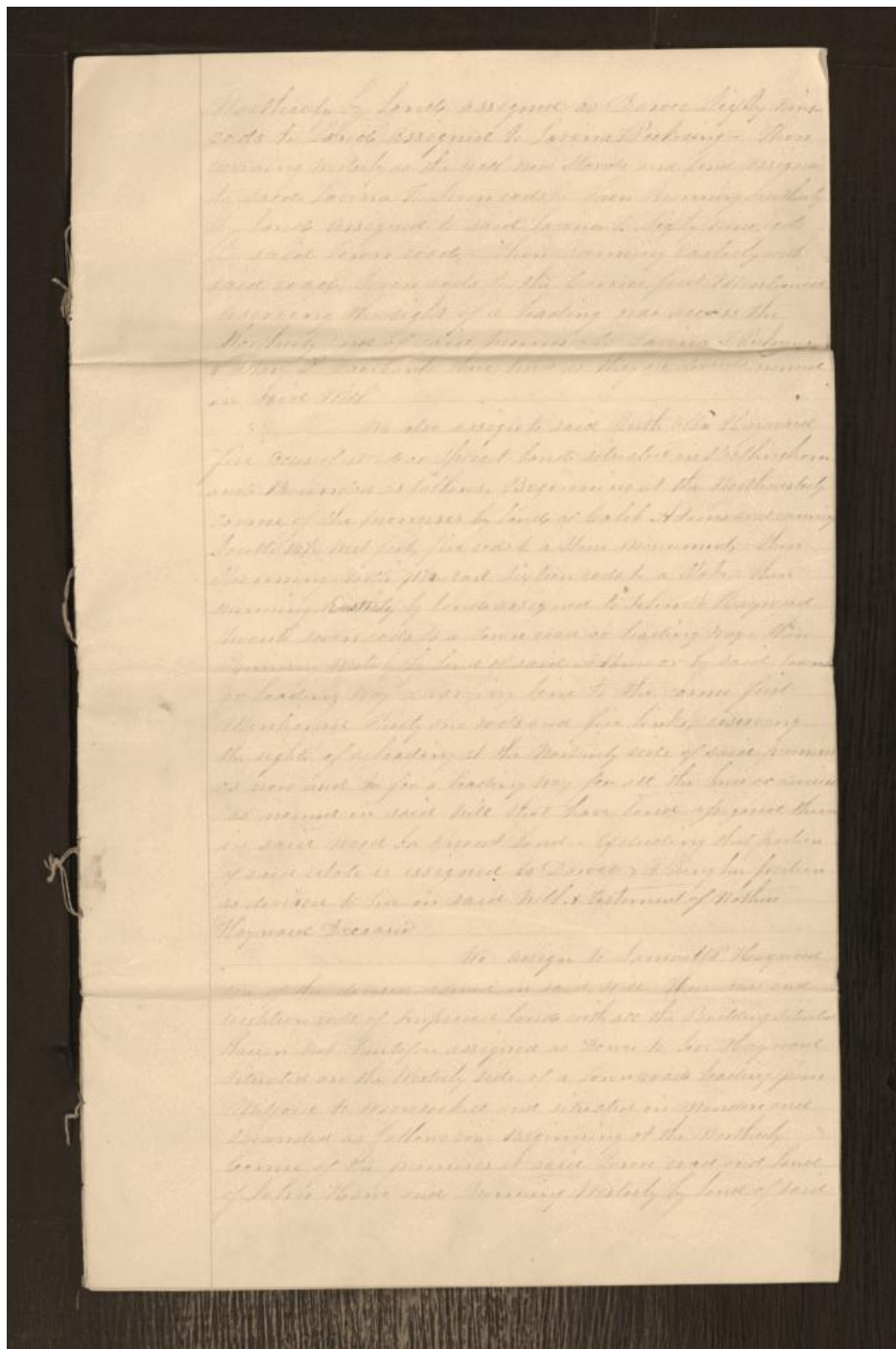


Situated in Mendon, containing Seven acres
and forty one rods and Bounded as follows.
Beginning at the Northwely corner of the
premises by lands assigned to Samuel P. Hayward
and lands set as down to Love Hayward and
Thurming. Westwely as the wall now stands by
lands assigned to Samuel P. Hayward. Twenty rods
and twenty three links to a stone wall. Then turning
westwely running Westwely with said wall twenty
three links. Then turning and running Northwely at
the wall now stands by lands assigned to Samuel P.
Redburne twenty three rods & four links to a stone
wall. Then turning and running Southwely by lands
of said Redburne & Redburne and as the wall now
stands twenty three rods and twelve links to a
stone wall line to lands assigned as above to
Love Hayward. Then running Eastwely as the
wall now stands by lands set off as above forty
five rods and twenty three links. Then running
Eastwely as the wall now stands twenty four
rods and twenty three links to the corner first
mentioned, reserving the right of having the
first line as above the line in lands assigned. &
to said Samuel P. Hayward in the Southwely
of his premises to contain uninclosed with the
privilege of gathering the fruit that grows on said
trees that project over on the premises of said
Ruth May. Also giving to said Ruth May the right
of a hedge row in common with them that
are reserved for the heirs on that part as above
mentioned.

We also assign to said Ruth May
Hayward three acres and three rods of wood
lands situated in Mendon and Bounded as
follows. Beginning at the Southwely
corner of the premises at a stone wall leading
from Bethelsham to Mendon and land assigned
as above to Love Hayward. Running

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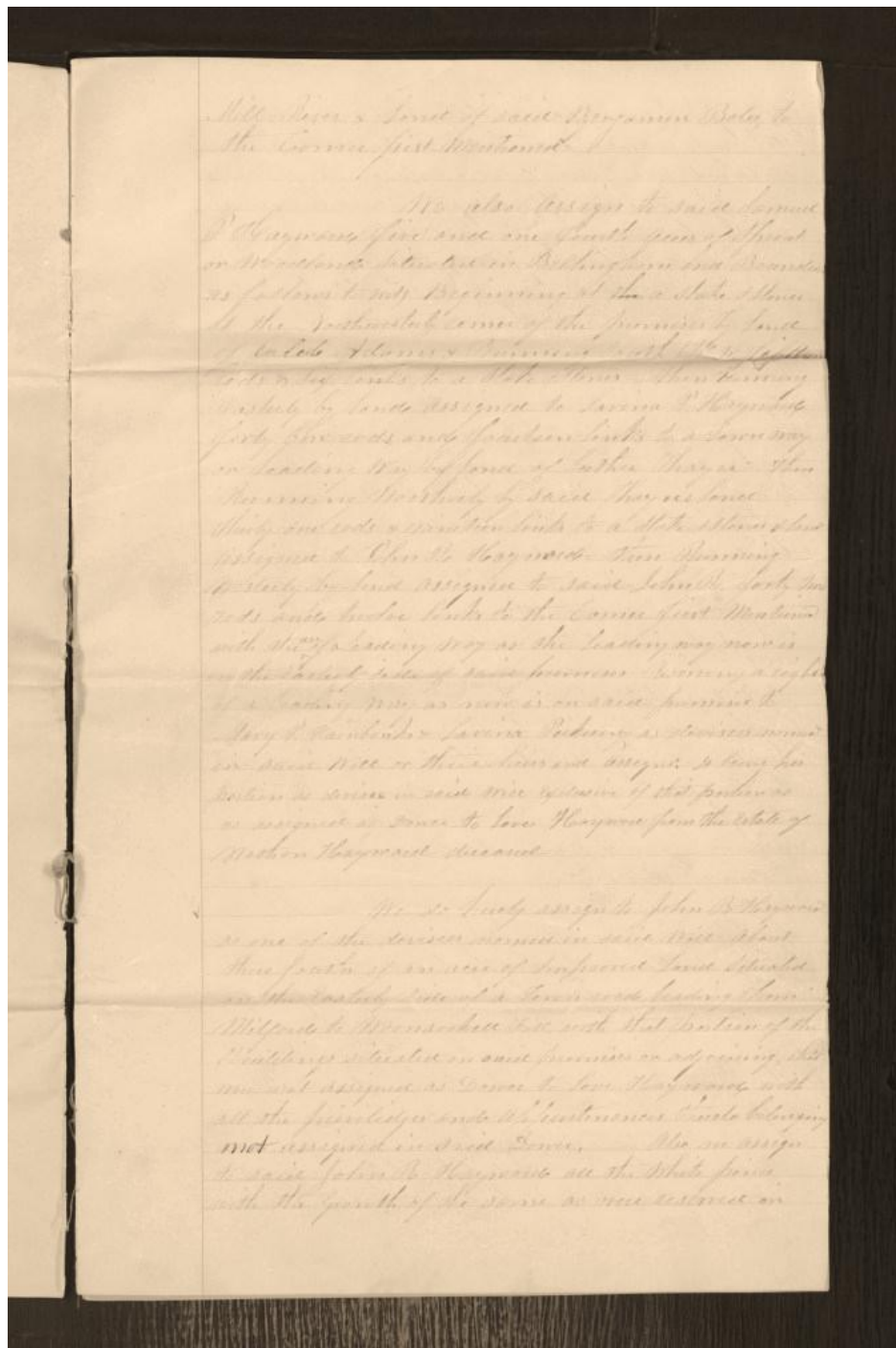
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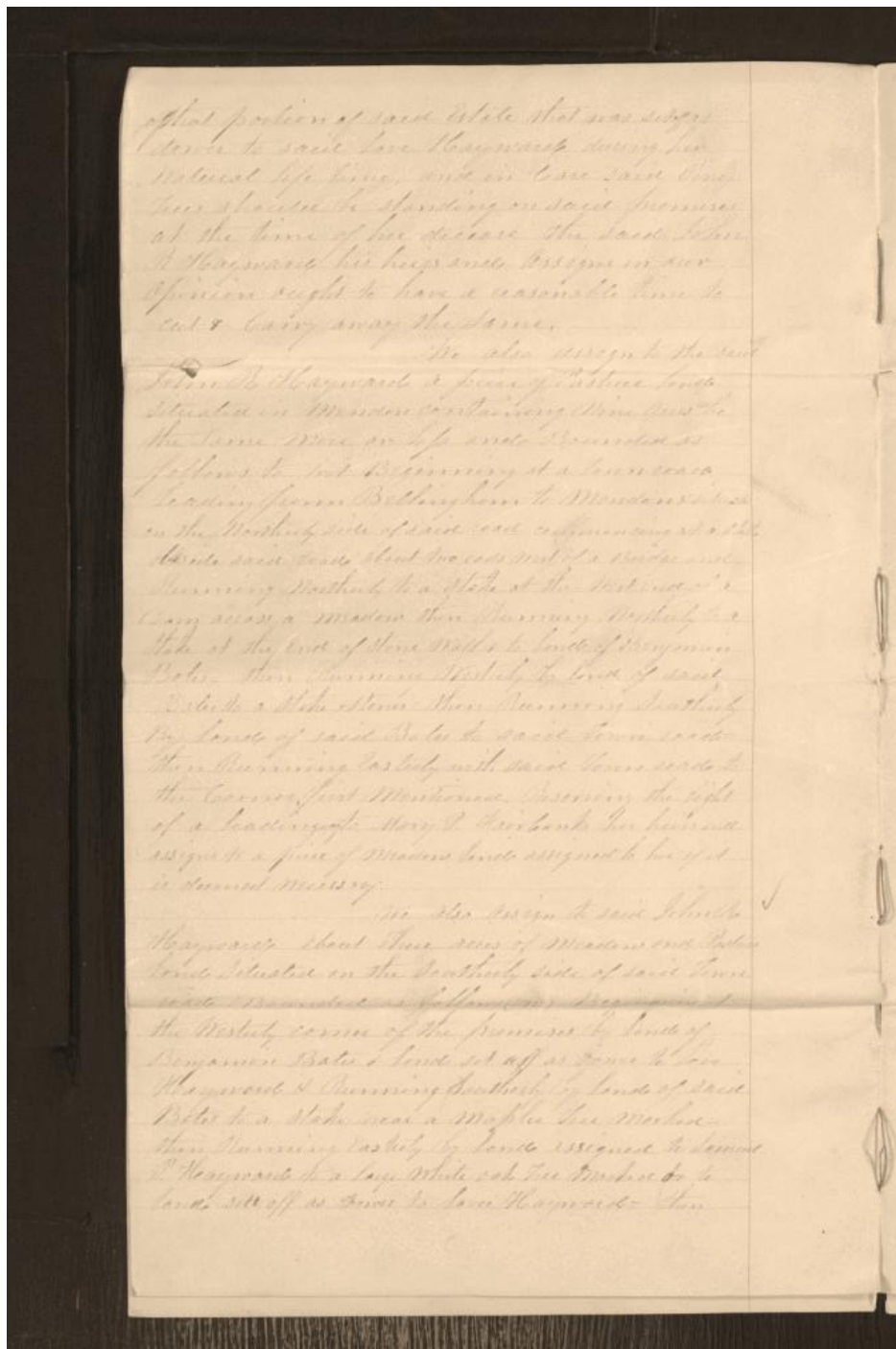
There is a stone wall, then running southerly on
said wall & land assigned to said John & Richard to
another stone wall & land assigned to said John & Richard
then running southerly to land assigned
to said John & Richard as the wall runs from the
top of said wall to the bottom of the same then running
southerly southerly southerly & southerly to land assigned
as before passing through the bridge, then running
southerly from the said bridge to the corner of the
Mortimer's, then running to the corner of the
Mortimer's & the right of having water from the well
as reserved in that part of said deed and all
other reservations that are reserved in that deed
assigned as before assigned said premises in common
with said John & Richard with the other owners of
premises on said well. Reserving all rights that
was reserved in said deed. Also assigning to said
John & Richard the right of having the first two sheep
from said premises in that portion of said well
that was first because the land in the southerly
& southerly side of said premises to remain reserved
also with the right of gathering what fruit that grows
on said trees that first because the land in said
described premises.

Also we assign to said John
& Richard about four acres of Meadow land
situated in Norton on the southerly side of a town
road leading from Norton to Northampton and
bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a little
more than half a mile from the town of Norton
North & running southerly to land assigned to John
John & Richard to a large & old tree on the land
assigned as before to John & Richard also running
thence southerly to a stone wall then running southerly to
said assigned as before to John & Richard to the

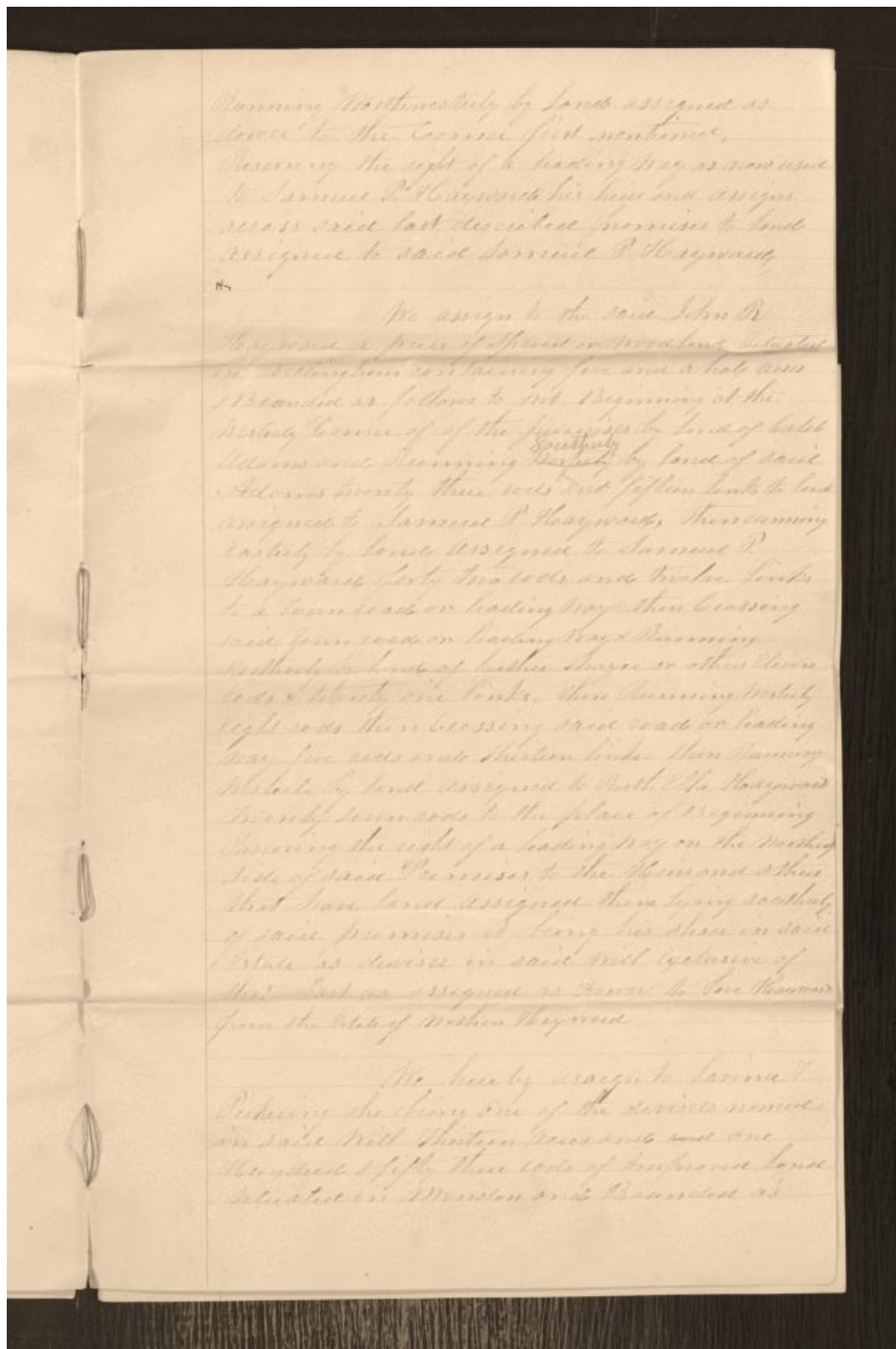


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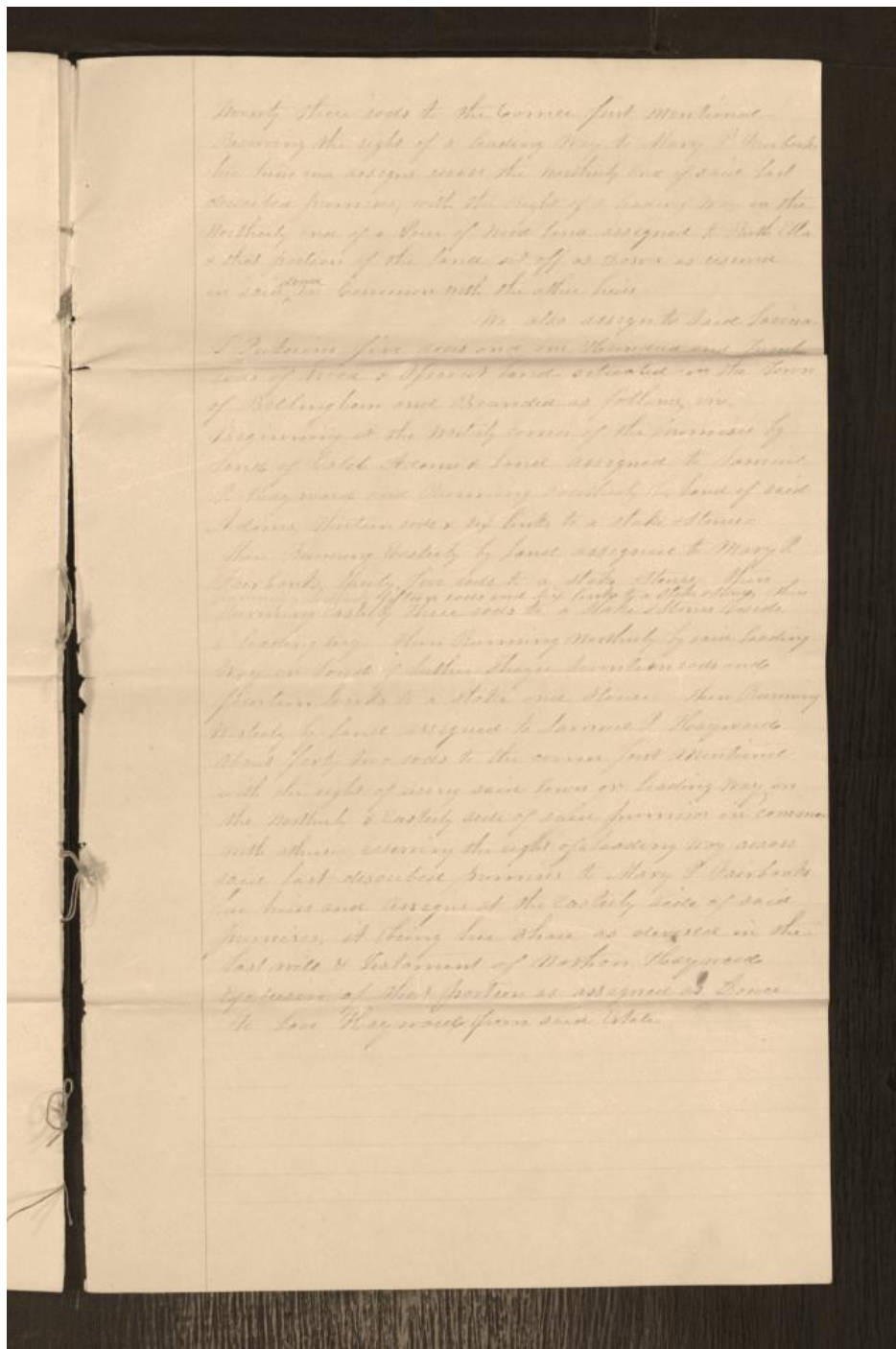
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follows to wit, beginning at the Northerly
 corner of the premises by lands assigned to
 James P. Hayward & lands of John Stone
 and running North 80° East by lands of
 said Stone eight feet rods and nine links
 to a stone wall. Then running South
 by lands assigned to Mary P. Fairbanks
 one of the sides and as the wall now
 stands forty two rods and fifteen links
 to a stone wall. Then running North 80° East
 thirty eight rods and four links to lands
 assigned to Ruth Ella Hayward. Then
 running North 80° East as the wall now stands
 twenty three rods and twelve links to a stone
 wall. Then turning & running North 80° East
 twenty seven rods and four links to land assigned to
 James P. Hayward. Then running North 80° East
 one side twenty rods and twelve links to the
 common fence meeting the right of having the
 fence line on land assigned to James P. Hayward on
 the westerly side of & assigned to him the same fence line
 on that point. The purpose beyond the line with the
 privilege of gathering what fruit that may grow on
 the same. We also assign to said James P.
 Hayward nine acres and one hundred and one hundred
 and forty seven rods of wood on Spruce and Spruce
 in said town and adjoining the same. The
 premises & boundaries as follows beginning at a stone
 wall at a stone wall and a stone wall leading
 from Hollingsworth to the stone wall and land assigned
 to Ruth Ella Hayward & running North 80° East

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We hereby assign to Mary P. Garbark
one of the shares named in said Will about
two acres of Pasture & Swamp land and Eighteen
and a half per cent of Wood and Spruce land
situated in said Mendon and bounded as
follows to wit beginning at the North corner of
said premises by line of John Howe & land
assigned to Savina & Pickering and running
North by line of John Howe about thirty one rods
to a stone stone at the end of stone road then
running South by line assigned to John
Hoycock about thirty eight rods to a stone stone at
the West end of a Barn across the stone road
then running South to a stone and stone land
said Barn about two rods end of the bridge
then running West by said stone road
to the stone stone and the line assigned to
Savina & Pickering then running North
about thirty nine rods to a stone assigned to
said Savina to a stone stone stone &
stone wall & to Pasture land assigned to said
Savina to then turning & running North as
