North  $2\frac{3}{4}$  east 33 rods and thirteen links to stones on rock  
 thence west  $2\frac{7}{8}$  north 22 rods and twenty two links to stones  
 thence north 45 east 26 rods by the fence thence east 22 north  
 8 rods by the fence thence east  $\frac{1}{2}$  north  $5\frac{3}{4}$  rods to the north
